

**Oklahoma Elector & Alternate
Elector Nomination Forms and
Procedures**

ELECTOR SELECTION PROCESS

Each year in Presidential election years, the Oklahoma Republican Party holds District and State Conventions for the purpose of electing Delegates to the Republican National Convention. At the State Convention two (2) Electors-at-Large and two (2) Alternate Electors-at-Large will be elected while at each District Convention one (1) Elector and one (1) Alternate Elector will be elected to meet with the Electoral College if the Republican Nominee is elected at the November general election. (*Proxies are not allowed at any convention*)

DISTRICT CONVENTIONS:

Each Congressional District will hold a convention to elect one (1) Elector and one (1) Alternate Elector. Nominations will be received according to the Convention Rules adopted by the District Convention. All Electors must be elected by a majority vote. The persons nominated must be registered Republicans from that Congressional District and submit a duly signed Affidavit of Acceptance included in this packet.

STATE CONVENTION:

The Republican State Convention will convene to elect two (2) Electors-at-Large and two (2) Alternate Electors-at-Large to the Republican Electoral College according to OKGOP Rules and State Convention Rules. All persons nominated must be registered Republicans in the State of Oklahoma and submit a duly signed Affidavit of Acceptance included in this packet. All Electors must be elected by a majority vote.

ELECTOR NOMINATION INSTRUCTIONS

ELECTORS CHOSEN AT THE DISTRICT CONVENTION

To run for the position of District Elector or District Alternate Elector at the district level, contact the appropriate District Chairman to inquire if the District Committee requests any information prior to the District Convention.

You will also need to fill out and sign an Affidavit of Acceptance and send it to the District Chairman.

OATH OF AFFIRMATION

I, _____, do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I am a registered voter in the Oklahoma Republican Party.

I further swear that if elected to the office of Presidential Elector at the next general election, I will cast my ballot as said Presidential Elector for the persons nominated for the offices of President and Vice President of the United States by the National Convention of the Republican Party of 2024 at a meeting to take place on December 17, 2024 at the Governor’s Office in the Oklahoma State Capitol, as stipulated by the oath required by the State of Oklahoma, which I agree to sign. (26 O.S. 1991, §10-102)

I further affirm that I have read and agree to the Penalty as stated below if I violate my oath.

§26-10-109. Penalty.

Any Presidential Elector who violates his oath as a Presidential Elector shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00).

OKLAHOMA LAW APPLICABLE TO PRESIDENTIAL ELECTORS

§26-10-101. Nomination of Presidential Electors - Certification.

The nominees for Presidential Electors of any recognized political party shall be selected at a statewide convention of said party in a manner to be determined by said party.

§26-10-102. Oath for Presidential Electors.

Every party nominee for Presidential Elector shall subscribe to an oath, stating that said nominee, if elected, will cast his ballot for the persons nominated for the offices of President and Vice President by the national convention of his party. Said oath shall be notarized by a notary public and filed with the Secretary of the State Election Board no fewer than ninety (90) days prior to the General Election. Failure of any party nominee to take and file said oath by said date shall automatically vacate his nomination and a substitute nominee shall be selected by the state central committee of the appropriate political party. It shall be the duty of the Secretary of the State Election Board to notify the chairman of the state central committee of the failure of any nominee to file said oath.

§26-10-107. Electors to meet - Duties.

Persons chosen as Presidential Electors shall meet at 10:00 a.m. in the Governor's office at the time appointed by the laws of the United States and cast their votes in the manner therein provided and perform such duties as may be required by law. Each such Elector shall receive mileage reimbursement at the rate as provided for state employees, said reimbursement to be paid from funds appropriated to the Office of the Governor.

§26-10-108. Vacancies.

In the event any Presidential Elector fails to meet at the Governor's office at the prescribed time, it shall be the duty of such Electors present at the time and place aforesaid to appoint a person to fill such vacancy.

§26-10-109. Penalty.

Any Presidential Elector who violates his oath as a Presidential Elector shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00).
